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#### Dollars and Cents - Year Ending March 31, 2023

The fiscal health care challenges facing the hospital having a direct impact on the financial performance include;

- Health Human Resources instability affecting recruitment and retention,
- Inflationary pressures & supply chain disruptions,
- Unfunded post pandemic protocols, and
- Stabilization of hospital services to address patient backlogs and meet population needs.

Overall, the net hospital operating margin deficit is (\$5.7M), and net consolidated operating margin deficit of (\$6.1M) taking into account specialty programs and non-shareable building depreciation. Financial statements and accompanying notes are available on the website for more information.

### 📮 Initiatives and Projects

Investing in capital infrastructure is a priority for PSFDH. In partnership with our hospital foundation and our community, we are working hard to raise the funds needed to keep our sites up to date, provide equipment to our physicians and staff, and break ground on new projects like our MRI and Electronic Medical Information System (Lumeo).





The addition of MRI technology at PSFDH is an amazing opportunity for our community. The MRI will support approximately 3,100 scans each year reducing wait times for our patients. The cost for the actual MRI machine is \$4.1 million. In addition to the cost of the MRI are is an additional \$2.1 million associated with renovating the space and installing the unit. Construction of the space is underway at the Smiths Falls Site of PSFDH. The Hospital will welcome the first patient for an MRI test in October 2023.

#### Perth Site Renewal Plans

The Perth Site of the PSFDH last underwent a major redevelopment in the 1990's. The building is now due for improvements. PSFDH Board of Directors and Leadership Team are working hard to ensure that the hospital remains viable and can meet the growing needs of our community. In 2023, PSFDH began the journey to expand our Perth site. The PSFDH pre-capital submission contemplates a complete redevelopment of the Perth site. When approved, it will likely take 7 to 10 years to complete.





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
